### CELEBRATION TIME!

This week's work will focus on R.E. More specifically on 'Celebration'. At this difficult time in our lives, it is important for us all to remember that there are MANY reasons to celebrate, and although we cannot do much now, in the future we will.

I would like you to create a '**Celebration Calendar**', which looks at the celebrations across the world, and includes some celebrations from all of the main world religions: Christianity, Judaism, Islam, Hinduism, Sikhism and Buddhism and Humanism. You can also **have an online picnic** and make an **invitation**.

What to do:

- 1) Research a main festival or celebration for each of these religions. You will find more than 1 for each. You need 1 celebration for each month of the year (**make sure you know the months of the year and can you spell them correctly**). If you do not have enough, you can fill in any months with celebrations that are important to you (e.g. your birthday) or any cultural celebrations, as opposed to religious (Valentine's Day, pancake day, firework night for instance).
- 2) Make a '**Celebration Calendar**' with a page a day (A4 or A5) pictures and some writing. You can draw pictures, cut out pictures from magazines or print them. Your writing can be handwritten or using a computer. For 6 of these you need to write 2 or 3 sentences about each. Make sure you include the date! How you make the calendar is up to you (you do not need all the days in each month, like in a real calendar, just the months is enough). You could even make a PowerPoint presentation if you fancy it! Select six of the celebrations to research in detail and present these as a longer, more detailed report (3/4 paragraphs on each).
- 3) I know most of you are in touch online. It is time for an **online picnic**! See if you can plan a time to video chat with at least one other person. Each **plan** and **make** yourselves a picnic (ask for help as you need to). Meet up online and picnic together! If you can, you could screen shot this and post on Dojo. Celebrate together virtually!
- 4) Plan how you would like to celebrate when everyone is allowed to meet together at school again. **Design an invitation** for a 'return to school' party. You could also make a suggested games, food and songs list.

What to do:

Lions - Select 3 of the celebrations that you know about and write 2 (or more) sentences about each.

Plan a **tea party** for your toys, yourself and your family. **Make an invite** and **help to make a picnic**, cakes or something similar. Take a picture of your celebration of your time at home! Plan how you would like to celebrate when everyone is allowed to meet together at school again. **Design an invitation** for a 'return to school' party.
